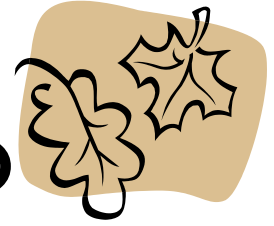


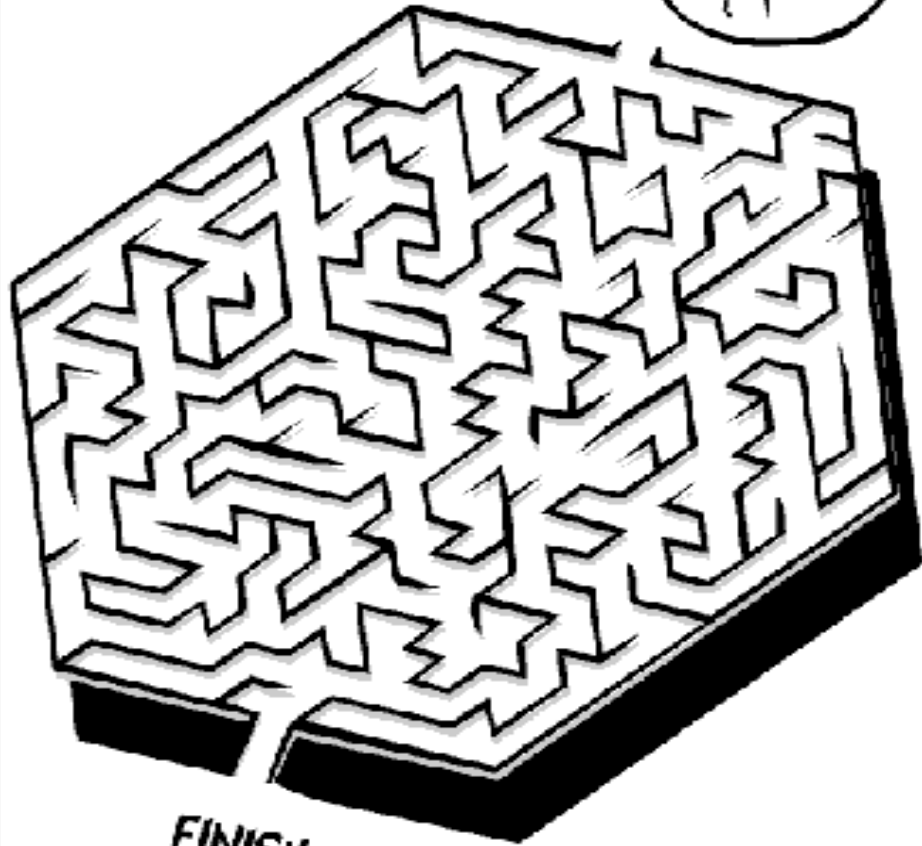

## **GARBAGE MANAGEMENT**

The Town is experiencing an issue with non-compliance of tagging garbage bags on a regular basis for pickup and disposal in a minority of cases. Thank you to those residents who are in compliance with the tag a bag program.

Garbage Personnel **cannot** pick up any garbage that does not conform to WYWRA regulations: Maximum size – 67 litre bags (26" x 32"). Maximum weight – 44 lbs. Bags not tagged with an official orange WYWRA tag.

You are in contravention of the Town's bylaw if you place bags in the Town's alley adjacent to your property that are not tagged. The penalty for doing so is \$50.00 for the first offence + \$200.00 each occurrence thereafter, plus the cost of cleanup. If you are stockpiling garbage bags on your property you may be creating a rodent hazard or odor smell which becomes a health and safety issue (provincial), or be subject to the Town's nuisance bylaw regarding untidy/unsightly lots.

## **Reminder**

**The Town of Lashburn has a bylaw to provide for charging the cost of fire suppression services within the Town of Lashburn directly on the person(s) who receive the service.**

**What this means to you is that you will need to purchase your own fire suppression coverage from your own insurance provider. All home owners and tenants are advised to take the necessary step to get this coverage.**

The Government of Saskatchewan is committed to the safety and security of senior citizens. The Ministry of Government Relations is helping achieve this with the Seniors Home Security Program. This program supports low-income seniors (with a net household income of \$35,000 or less) and seniors who have been a victim of a break and enter or home invasion.

The Seniors Home Security Program offers deadbolts, door viewers, smoke alarms, smoke alarm batteries, and carbon monoxide detectors. The program will also provide installation of these items and a security assessment of their home, at no charge to the senior.

### Snickers Caramel Apple Salad

Servings: 12

#### Ingredients:

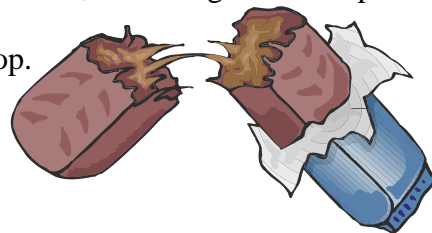
- 6 (2 1/4 ounce) Snickers candy bars, chill and chop
- 6 apples, cored and chopped into bite sized pieces (Granny Smith and/or Red Delicious)
- 1 (12 ounce) container Cool Whip
- 1 (5 ounce) box instant vanilla pudding (Use dry mix, DO NOT prepare!)
- or 1 (5 ounce) box butterscotch pudding mix (Use dry mix, DO NOT prepare!)

#### Garnish for extra flair:

- 1/2 cup caramel ice cream topping (optional) or 1/2 cup caramel apple dip (optional)
- 1/2 cup chopped peanuts can also sprinkled on top (optional)

#### Directions:

- 1 Mix cool whip and dry pudding mix together.
- 2 Chop apples and chilled Snickers.
- 3 Mix together.
- 4 Heat caramel sauce a bit in the microwave- just enough to drizzle, not enough to heat up salad.
- 5 Drizzle caramel sauce over salad and sprinkle peanuts on top.
- 6 Chill for at least an hour-- Voila!

The Lashburn Community Hall has been in our community for almost 24 years, and has been a great place to hold our community events. It is sure we can all recollect some great memories of these great events. Over the past year the hall board has been busy fundraising and receiving donations required to make the necessary upgrades and changes needed to keep the hall in good shape. Our St Patty's day event went wonderfully and many attendees are wondering if it will be an annual event. The lovely ladies that, for decades, have organized our fall supper have passed the responsibility on to the hall board and with their amazing help and the wonderful cooks in our community, this fall we continued the tradition.

The building was built very well with lots of help and suggestions from the community and hall board members over the years. We would like to keep the community involved and welcome any suggestions. Our plans are to upgrade flooring, painting, do some kitchen renos (including new counters, sinks and flooring), install an upgraded sound system, and overhaul the restrooms. If you cannot make it out next week, but would still like to help, please contact one of our board members. After the flooring is complete we will also be looking for volunteers to reinstall toilets and do some minor carpentry and plumbing for the new dishwasher and wash sink.

We are all very excited to see some of these renos completed and look forward to many more good times in our wonderful community hall, but really need your support. There is a sign-up sheet posted at the Lashburn Credit Union, or just feel free to stop by and lend a hand (or contact a board member). Please bring tools that you think may be required (hammers, scrapers, wrenches, screwdrivers, etc.). We look forward to seeing you all there to make our community hall look wonderful once again.
