Happy New Year!

As we start the New Year the planning process for many things gets underway.

The Town would like to remind residents to bring their garbage and organic materials bins off the street after they are dumped or that evening. The problem that exists in the winter is the snow removal equipment must go around them which causes problems. We hope everyone cooperates with this matter.

With winter comes snow and with snow comes snow removal. The Town would like to remind all residents that it removal of snow from town sidewalks is the homeowner's responsibility. The Town will eventually clear sidewalks but they are not the first priority of snow removal. As residents, please do not shovel excess snow from your property onto town streets, back alleys or drainage ditches. As snow is removed from the streets, please be aware that the Town will pile some snow or grade to the middle of the street for later removal. When driving please be aware of the piles of snow.

The Town would like to encourage residents to sign up for the Saskatchewan Alert system. This is a great application to provide you with notifications in cases of emergencies, public notices and severe weather conditions. The alerts are immediate and brief. Simply go to the application store and download the app today! It is well worth it!

The budget process begins in the New Year. During this time, Council will have discussions regarding past spending and reviewing all 2020 projects. Council will also look to 2020-2021 for allocation of money for new projects or ventures. If you have any suggestions in regards to things you would like to see done or considered please do not hesitate to contact the Mayor or member of Council. One priority continuing in 2020 will an emphasis on streets and street improvements.

We will also start the planning process for the 12th Annual Community Days in June. Council will have a preliminary meeting in January or early February and then open the process to community organizations. If you have a desire to serve on the committee and help organize please leave your name at the Town Office. We welcome participation from all community organizations!

In February, Councilor Covey and I will be attending the 115th SUMA Convention in Regina from February 2nd – 5th. This is an annual convention in which delegates from across the province join together for workshops, presentations, and an opportunity to discuss municipal issues with provincial government representatives. I will post SUMA updates on my Facebook Page during the Convention. I will include an update summary about the convention in the next Minute with the Mayor.

The Town does its best to inform all residents of upcoming changes, rate increases or news about the community. Please make sure you check the Town Facebook page, the bulletin board, the Scoop and the information provided in your water bill. The water bill can sometimes contain both paper copies of letters and notations on the water bill. So please read carefully.

Government of Saskatchewan

The Town of Lashburn would like to remind town residents that your personal property such as boats, campers, utility trailers etc. cannot be parked on town owned lots or boulevards for extended periods of time, this includes motor homes. Camper Pullouts are not allowed to jut out over sidewalks or into the street.

Unlicensed or partly dismantled vehicles cannot be parked on the street or town boulevards at any time.

Any time any type of trailer is parked on a town street it must be licensed and attached to a currently licensed vehicle for transporting. Parking vehicles where it impedes sight of moving traffic at intersections is prohibited.

No parking within 5 meters of any intersection or fire hydrant.

Anything in contravention of the Town's Bylaw is liable to a \$100.00 fine and unit may be towed and impounded.
