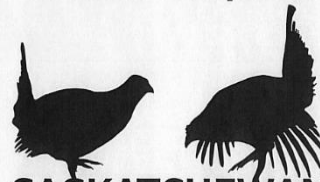

Minute with the Mayor April 2018

Well spring is almost here!

With the warmer temperatures expected and melting snow we have the spring water issues and a period of rough roads. The Town employees have cleaned drainage ditches and are currently steaming lines to ensure the runoff water can move quickly through town. If you see drainage areas that are backing up please notify the Town Office so the issue can be dealt with before it becomes a bigger problem.

Town Council has completed preliminary budget discussions for the new fiscal year. Council has a few minor aspects to discuss and then the budget should be formalized by the end of April. We will share long term plans for spending, priorities and some highlights in the coming weeks. The Provincial budget was delivered on Tuesday, April 10th and at this time municipalities will find out what the revenue sharing will be for 2018-2019. The Premier has indicated there will be no change in the revenue sharing for municipalities which means our provincial funding will remain the same.

As you may have noticed there are several streets that are rougher than normal. The Town Council realizes that it is a source of great frustration and aggravation for taxpayers. The grader will be on the streets as soon as possible to eliminate some of the pot holes. Council continues to look for long term solutions to addressing the road issue with the application of SB90 product. Part of the short term solution there will be a greater emphasis on a regular grading schedule to keep the roads in better shape.

Community Day 2018 is fast approaching! The committee will be meeting on Monday, April 16th at 6:30 in the Town Office. We are hoping that community organizations and interested individuals will get involved with helping the committee plan the event. Community Day will take place on Saturday, June 16th. If your community organization would like to sponsor an event or be part of the day please contact the Town Office. Remember this is an opportunity to celebrate living in a great community!
