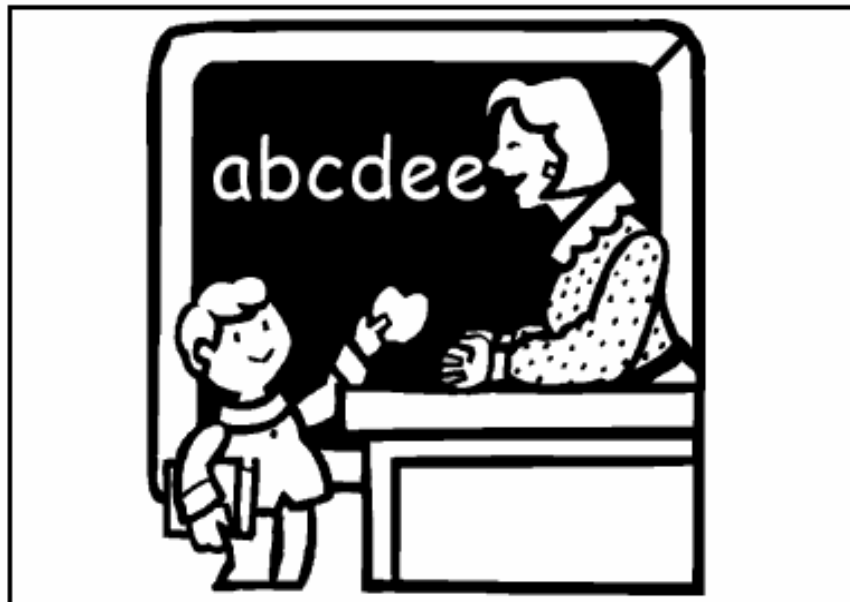
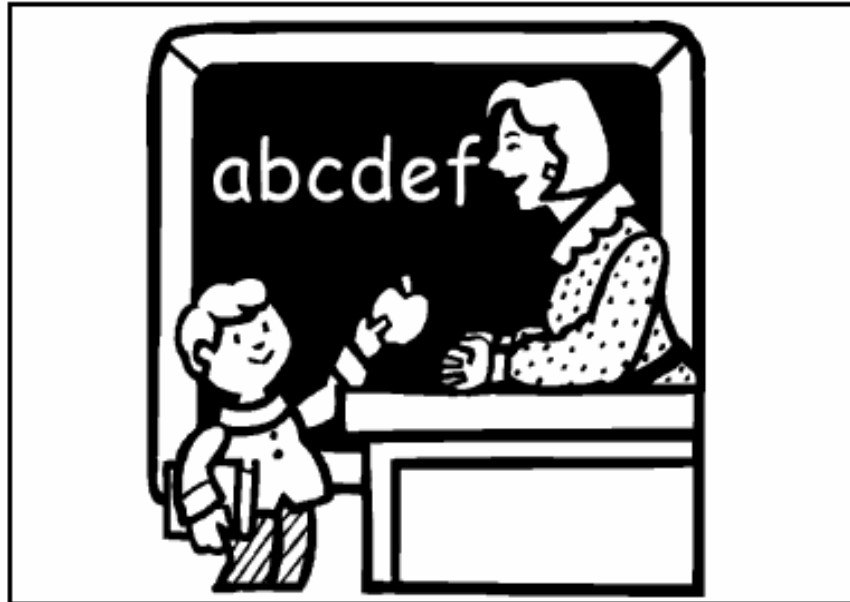

## Minute with the Mayor

September, 2015

As fall approaches there are still many things the town is hoping to accomplish on the Public Works list.

Town Council would like to thank all those individuals who participated in the lawn edging contest for a free water bill. We had 8 residents complete the edging and enter the contest. The lucky winner was Jim Hutchinson. I am sure in the spring Council will look at having another contest.

Big news on the playground front. The Town has finally received the go ahead from the Ministry of the Environment to proceed with the site. The holes will be filled in and work will begin in earnest to get the playground in usable shape. The playground replacement is Phase I of several phases to improve the park area around Heritage Park. If you have any ideas please forward them to the Town for consideration. Also I would like to thank the committee for their hard work with fundraising for the new playground structure. It sure will be an improvement from the old structure!

Town Councillors have identified several hedges throughout the community that have grown over the sidewalks. These hedges make sidewalks hard to walk on. The Public Works employees will be trimming back hedges that are a problem. If you have any concerns about this please let the Town Office know as soon as possible.

The Town is also very happy to have finally completed the road repairs on 1<sup>st</sup> Street East and the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The ground surface under the pavement has been sealed with fly ash and a French drain system has been installed. A new culvert has been placed in the road to allow the water to flow north of Town in the drainage system. One problem in the area is some homeowner's continually pumping water from their sumps onto the street. The best solution is to pump the water into your yard and be absorbed by the grass as the Town's policy dictates not to pump water off of your property.

Communities in Bloom is still looking for a coordinator for the organization for next year. Bonnie Holtby is stepping back from the lead role and has indicated she would gladly help the new people providing advice and guidance. If you are interested in taking a lead role in the organization please let the Town Office know.

Just a reminder about dogs and pet owner responsibility. Please be aware that your dog may be causing problems in your neighbourhood either by running loose or with excessive barking. We ask that you cooperate with your neighbours if there are problems. After all having the issue solved by neighbours sometimes is the best way to eliminate a problem.

The Town of Lashburn would like to remind town residents that your personal property such as boats, campers, utility trailers etc. cannot be parked on town owned lots or boulevards for extended periods of time, this includes motor homes. Camper Pullouts are not allowed to jut out over sidewalks or into the street.

Unlicensed or partly dismantled vehicles cannot be parked on the street or town boulevards at any time. Any time any type of trailer is parked on a town street it must be licensed and attached to a currently licensed vehicle for transporting. Parking vehicles where it impedes sight of moving traffic at intersections is prohibited.

Anything in contravention of the Town's Bylaw is liable to a \$100.00 fine and may be towed and impounded.

## Online/Telephone Banking Payments

made to the Town of Lashburn are put towards your amounts owing to the Town **on the date the Town receives the monies in their bank account (not the date you made the payment)**

If you are making payments that receive a discount such as taxes, please be aware it can take up to five banking days before your payment may be received by the Town of Lashburn. You may not receive your anticipated discount if the money is not deposited into the Town's bank account by the discount date.

This also applies to payments that are mailed. They must be received by the Town by the discount due date (the last day of the month).

## ENGINE RETARDER BRAKES

The Town of Lashburn has enacted a Bylaw to prohibit the use of engine retarder brakes within the town limits.

Any person who contravenes this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable upon summary conviction to a fine of \$250.00.

The Town of Lashburn respectfully asks that all Truckers please refrain from the use of engine retarder brakes on Highway 16 when accessing the West Service Road to head north or turning south to access Altex.

The Town would also request the same from trucks heading towards Lashburn off the Grid Road on the North town limits.

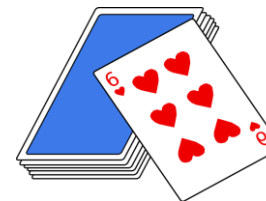
