Minute with the Mayor

July

I hope people are enjoying the summer holidays. The weather has been beautiful so I hope you are taking advantage of it and enjoying some time relaxing and traveling around for the next few weeks.

As stated in the spring the Town Council has made the improvement of the streets in Lashburn a top priority. Sometimes progress seems to be slow at coming but please remember in order for some work to be completed the Town is dependent on the schedules of other companies. In the coming days the Public Works employees will be applying the SB90 products to a few more streets in Town. Town Council has been pleased with the way in which the product has held up and the driving surface it has created. The product is more expensive than regular dust proofing products so it will take a few years to have the entire Town completed. We value your opinion so please do not hesitate to contact the Town Office or any individual member of Council. During the past few weeks the Town has undertaken the fix and repair of some major frost boils. Town Council allocated additional money this year to remedy the situation. The Town has also completed paving of all areas that required fixing because of water main breaks. We appreciate your cooperation in the process of getting the streets repaired.

In an effort to control speed on 2nd Street East we have replaced the removable speed bump with a permanent one. This became necessary because the previous speed bumps were tampered with or in the last incident completely taken. As a Council we feel it is important to have a speed bump on this street to reduce speed. This is a high pedestrian traffic area and we want to keep everyone safe. So by reducing the speed we will keep people safer.

As you may have noticed the surface has been paved in Heritage Park and this will be utilized as a multipurpose area. We are in the process of arranging a picker truck to lift the pieces to be placed in the new skateboard park. We hope that this will happen soon as I know many are itching to try out the new ramps and jumps. The outdoor rink will also be reassembled in the coming weeks for the winter season. The Town is working to improve the park and make it more of an inviting green space for residents in our community. Watch for more updates as we plan for new upgrades to the space.

Just a quick reminder about complaints and concerns you may have about the Town. As residents there are several options available to you. These include contacting the Mayor or any member of Town Council by phone or in person, sending a message to the Mayors Facebook page, sending a private message to the Town Facebook page, or go in person to the Town Office with your complaint or concern. If you want Council to address and discuss the complaint please remember to make a formal complaint so that it is included on the agenda of the Council Meeting.

August Council Meeting

As there is only one Council Meeting in August – on August 27th, 2018, please ensure you have any matter you are aware of that will require Council's attention prior to August 27th, 2018, brought to the attention of the Town Office so it can be handled at the July 30th, 2018 Council Meeting.

FIRE PIT SPECIFICATIONS

- a) To be located in back yards only, a minimum of 3 meters (10 feet) clearance from building, property lines, or other combustible material.
- b) The burning area not to exceed 1 meter (3 feet) in width, height or diameter when measured between the widest points.
- c) The fire pit/fireplace shall have enclosed sides made from bricks, concrete blocks, heavy gauge metal or other non-combustible material acceptable to the Fire Chief.
- d) A spark arrester mesh screen with openings no larger than 1.25 cm (1/2 inch) and constructed of expanded metal must be used to cover the fire pit opening in a manner sufficient to contain and reduce the hazards of airborne sparks.

The Town of Lashburn would like to remind town residents that your personal property such as boats, campers, utility trailers etc. cannot be parked on town owned lots or boulevards for extended periods of time, this includes motor homes. Camper Pullouts are not allowed to jut out over sidewalks or into the street.

Unlicensed or partly dismantled vehicles cannot be parked on the street or town boulevards at any time. Any time any type of trailer is parked on a town street it must be licensed and attached to a currently licensed vehicle for transporting. Parking vehicles where it impedes sight of moving traffic at intersections is prohibited. No parking within 5 meters of any intersection or fire hydrant. Anything in contravention of the Town's Bylaw is liable to a \$100.00 fine and unit may be towed and impounded.

REVISED ACCEPTABLE ITEMS LIST FOR RECYCLING

The Town of Lashburn's provider of recycling services will be narrowing the list of acceptable materials in the bluebag recycling program. This is necessary due to the precipitous drop in commodity markets and the greatly increased industry expectations of purity rates on sorted recyclable commodities.

- Anything other than a plastic container that has a number 1 or 2 should go directly into the waste.
- Any paper container that contained a food item should not go in the recycling.
 - Photos are not recyclable.
 - Please remove book covers from books.
- Tin and aluminum food plates are often laminated and not recyclable.
