Please remove waste & organics carts from the street as soon as possible after pick up. This will ensure the grading of streets can proceed effectively. The Town will not be responsible for grading around carts.

The Town and the Cemetery Committee are excited to announce the purchase of a Columbarium for the Lashburn Cemetery. As more information becomes available it will be put out to the public. If you would like to have your name put on a list for information please call the Town Office.

The Town of Lashburn would like to remind town residents that your personal property such as boats, campers, utility trailers etc. cannot be parked on town owned lots or boulevards for extended periods of time, this includes motor homes. Camper Pullouts are not allowed to jut out over sidewalks or into the street. Unlicensed or partly dismantled vehicles cannot be parked on the street or town boulevards at any time.

Any time any type of trailer is parked on a town street it must be licensed and attached to a currently licensed vehicle for transporting. Parking vehicles where it impedes sight of moving traffic at intersections is prohibited.

No parking within 5 meters of any intersection or fire hydrant.

Anything in contravention of the Town's Bylaw is liable to a \$100.00 fine and unit may be towed and impounded.

GFL COVID-19: Guidelines for Safe Garbage Disposal

As waste collectors continue to work hard, there are steps you can take to protect them and your community as a whole. Please consider our workers and practice the following steps to SAFELY dispose of your waste.

1. BAG and SEAL your garbage

- Place garbage securely in sealed bags (with no holes). Please note we cannot collect loose items at this time.
- If your container has a lid, ensure it's fully closed to avoid loose windblown items.

2. DO NOT place used tissues/ napkins/ wipes, etc. loose in ANY CONTAINER

- Items for cleaning or personal use (including masks and gloves) MUST be disposed of in tightly-sealed garbage bags and placed in the garbage ONLY.

3. If you're sick, bag it TWICE

- If you, anyone in your household, or anyone you've been in contact with is sick, place your garbage in a bag, then put that bag in a second bag. If in doubt, bag it twice!

4. Leave SUFFICIENT SPACE at the curb

- Ensure at least 4 ft of space between your containers and any obstacles (such as vehicles) so our collectors don't need to manually handle them.

5. SANITIZE

- Wipe down your containers. This is especially important if you've touched them.

6. Practice SAFE disposal of household hazardous waste (HHW)

- HHW such as chemical cleaning products should NOT be placed in the garbage. For guidance on safe disposal, check your local/municipal HHW collection program.

Minute with the Mayor May, 2020

The Town has almost completed the budget process. We will continue with the infrastructure programs which include the completion of resurfacing the service road and the water service upgrades for the Main Street. Also on the list is the resurfacing of Main Street. The Town will also continue with the SB90 street surfacing that was started 2 years ago. In the next Minute with the Mayor I will outline some of the capital projects passed by the Town.

The Town is once again pleased to support the efforts of JH Moore students as they do the annual Town clean up. This event is much valued and is an example of young people showing pride in their community. On behalf of the Town Council I would like to thank the staff and students for continuing to do this clean up during these unusual times! I look forward to seeing the pictures on the school Facebook page!

There have been a few questions about the proposed pipeline for water to Lashburn. As the Province moves to open up in phases the Town will be working with SaskWater to hold a public meeting when we are allowed. Once this is set we will inform the Community as it is important for residents to have a say in the future of water distribution in Lashburn.

The Communities in Bloom organization will once again be planting the various garden spaces, the hanging baskets and town barrels. Watch for more details in the coming days as the areas are prepared for planting. If you are interested in helping please do not hesitate to contact me or leave your name at the Town Office.

Just a reminder, the skate park and play structure are still closed as per Provincial government guidelines. When guidelines change the Town will reopen the areas. Thank you for your cooperation.

Also please remember the Annual Community Day celebration has been cancelled for 2020. The Town will plan for 2021. If you are interested in helping with planning please don't hesitate to let us know. We would love the input and new ideas.

If you are a pet owner please remember it is your responsibility to clean up after your pets when out walking. Dogs should also not be allowed to roam free in the community so we ask you to do your part and keep them in your fenced yard or tied up. In regards to barking dogs please contact the Town Office for the procedures. We will work with residents to find a solution.

The Town will once again be hiring a Summer Student for 2020. In the coming days or weeks our new hire will begin working in the community. It is always nice to take advantage of the opportunity to employ a student over the summer. The position allows for the Town to get a few more projects done as the student is able to maintain grass cutting, weed whipping and other designated tasks.


